

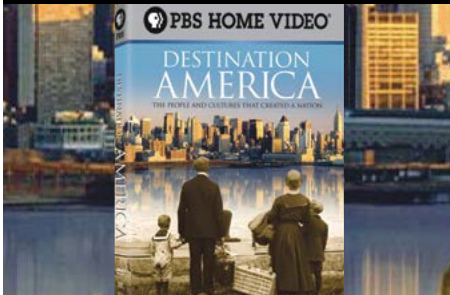

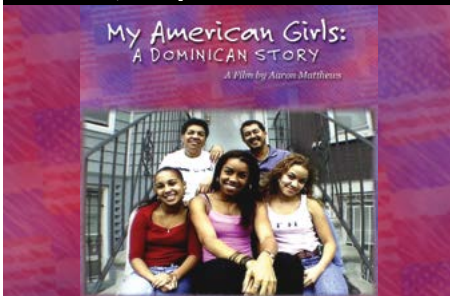

Pamela Varkony is a journalist, commentator and teacher. She runs a personal mentoring service, "Conversations & Inspirations," and is co-author of a book on the history of Bucks County called *Our Lost Tobikon Valley*. She is also the Pearl S. Buck International 2017 Woman of Influence.

Linda C. Wisniewski writes for the *Bucks County Herald* and the *Bucks County Women's Journal*. She is the author of the memoir, *Off Kilter* and the Grand Prize Winner of the Wild River Review contest.
