The Annual Festival of Trees at the Pearl S. Buck National Historic Landmark House will be held from Tuesday, November 12 through December 30, 2019. Guided tours are available daily. Twilight Tours are available at specific days and times, by reservation only.

The Festival of Trees is one of the most unique and historic holiday traditions in the region. Each year during this festival, the rooms of Pearl S. Buck's iconic Bucks County stone farmhouse come alive with the glow of holiday decorations. The event showcases beautiful trees and vignettes designed and decorated by some of Bucks County's best artists, decorators, and local community groups to convey the spirit of Pearl S. Buck's legacy as an author, activist, and humanitarian.
