He also enjoys drawing, singing and dancing. At home, he helps in tending livestock, cleaning the house and running simple errands.

Josh's is living with his parents. His father, Joseph Castillejos, 27 years old, works as a Construction worker and earns \$105 monthly. His mother, Angelica David, 30 years old is a housewife. His father's income usually spent on food, utilities and education. We would like to introduce to you other members of the family. They are the following:

Josh has been in the area for 7 years now. They are living in a rental house which costs \$41 monthly. The house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof, cemented walls and cemented floorings that is in good condition. It has 2 rooms with 4 windows. They use electricity as source of light. The family is able to eat three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from their own water pipe and use gas stove for cooking. The family has their own water sealed toilet and their household garbage is disposed of through government waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Castillejos family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having the child's complete education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, implements programs in health, education and psycho-social development and protection that benefit the children, their families and communities in the area. We hope that through the PSBP sponsorship program, the Castillejos family could take part in our programs.
