Dian loves to play hide-and-peek and other outdoor activities with his friends in the neighborhood but due to pandemic he only stays at home to play for now. He also enjoys singing, watching TV and gardening. At home, he helps in fetching water, cleaning the house and running simple errands.

Dian's parents were separated since he was born and has no communication with his father at all. He is living with his mother, grandparents and other relatives. His mother, Myra Flores, 41 years old, online seller and earns \$84 monthly. His grandfather, Damian Flores Jr, 75 years old, a Farmer and earns \$42 monthly. His aunt, Shiela Lacbayo, 44 years old, online seller and earns \$105 monthly. Their income usually spent on food, utilities and education. Dian has been in the area for 13 years now. They are living a shared house which is owned by his grandparents. The house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof, cemented walls and cemented floorings that is in good condition. It has 4 rooms with 2 windows. They use electricity as source of light. The family is able to eat three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from their own water pipe and use gas stove for cooking. The family has their own water sealed toilet and their household garbage is disposed through government disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Flores family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having the child's complete education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, implements programs in health, education and psychosocial development and protection that benefit the children, their families and communities in the area. We hope that through the PSBP sponsorship program, the Flores family could take part in our programs.
