Quiro loves to play race, patintero and other outdoor activities with his friends in the neighborhood but due to pandemic he only stays at home to play for now. He also enjoys singing, dancing and reading. At home, he helps by running simple errands.

Quiro's parents are separated since 2012. He is living with her mother and grandmother. His mother, Maricar Lanuza, 33 years old is currently unemployed because of the pandemic and his grandmother, Carmelita Lanuza, 57 years old who sells religious items and earns \$116 monthly is the sole earner in the family as of the moment. The income usually spent on food, utilities and education. We would like to introduce to you other members of the family. They are the following:

Quiro has been in the area for 5 months now. They are living in their own house. The house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof, cemented walls and cemented floorings that is in good condition. It has 2 rooms with 1 window. They use electricity as source of light. The family is able to eat three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from their own water pipe and use gas stove for cooking. The family has their own water sealed toilet and their household garbage is disposed of through government waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Romarate family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having the child's complete education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, implements programs in health, education and psychosocial development and protection that benefit the children, their families and communities in the area. We hope that through the PSBP sponsorship program, the Romarate family could take part in our programs.

The sponsorship assistance that the PSBP could provide would greatly support Quiro's education and his family as well. PSBP is committed in helping the children achieve their full potential, build better lives through its various programs.
