On behalf of Pearl S. Buck Foundation (Thailand), we are pleased to introduce you to Noppasit Petchtai and his family. Noppasit was born on March 8, 2019. He is now 2 years old. He stands 2'9" and weighs 22.05 lbs. Noppasit, who is fondly called "Petch", is a Thai and Buddhist boy. He is affected by HIV/AIDS. He can speak both Thai language and Northeastern dialect.

Petch lives with his family in a big community in Muang district, Ubon Ratchathani province. There are around 100 household in this community. Most of people are farmers and agriculturists who grow rice and plants. After harvest season some of them go to work at as general workers at other places. There are a temple and a school located in this community.

Petch is in good health, he has received vaccinations per schedules. He has growth and good developments per standard of Thai children. He eats 3 meals per day cooked by his mother. Petch and family are benefited from government health insurance program.

Petch is a cute, cheerful, and talkative boy. He is attending in pre-kindergarten class at a public child development center named Tung Khun Yai Child Development Center, located around 3 km from his home. He goes to the center by motorcycle with his father. He receives USD 0.66 (USD 1=Baht 30) as daily allowance to buy sweets at the center. He is benefited from the center free lunch program for children. He can study in the moderate level. He is diligent in going to the center. Music is his favorite subject. He wishes to be an artist when he grows up. He enjoys drawing and coloring pictures. Red is his favorite color. Soccer is his favorite sport. He has a lot of friends, and can get along well all of them. In free time he enjoys running for fun, and playing games with friends. He helps his mother to do some house works such as to sweep floor and fill drinking water.

Your generous support is needed for Petch as it will assist him to have more readiness in studying, and more willpower in paying good attention in studying continuously to graduate from high educational level for better future of himself and his family. His family is very poor, his family earns very few and uncertain income per year that is not enough to cover family's living cost and children's education expenses. Without your kind support Petch may decide to drop schooling before he completes compulsory level in order to help his parents working in the field to earn income for supporting whole family.

Petch's maternal grandmother, Mrs. Kampa, is 65 years old. His mother, Mrs. Jumpa, is 43 years old. She was infected with HIV and has taken anti virus medicines. His father, Mr. Nopparat, is 30 years old and a worker. His oldest brother, Preecha, is 16 years old, and studying in grade 10. His older brother, Suriya, is 14 years old and completed grade 6, he does not continue studying. The family earns around USD 1,000 per year as farmers and worker. Everyone in his family is in good health. They live simply and happily together

The family has stayed in this community for years. They live in two stories half concrete and half wooden house with zinc roof built high above the ground. Petch's grandmother owns land legally. It has 3 bedrooms, one open room, one kitchen, and one toilet. The surrounding is quite pleasant with no pollution. There is also some space for children to play. The family grows some vegetables for cooking foods. The house has electricity and is furnished with one television, one electric fan, one iron, and light bulbs. There is clean water both from a well and water supply system for using and drinking in his family. Household garbage is disposed by burning several kilometers away from their home.

Like any other Thai family, Petch's family wishes to improve their quality of life. They dream of having their school age family members complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house, and most importantly increase their income.

Petch and his family need assistance, and your kind sponsorship will make a difference in their lives. Your support will usher in new hope and confidence in the family as they work together for a brighter future. We commit to facilitate a family development process for this family so they achieve lasting improvement in their lives. Our foundation implements programs on **Health, Education, Livelihood and Psycho-social** developments from which this family can benefit. We do this through the handed-up approach of partnership so families develop their self-help abilities to learn in building up what they can do with a little assistance, motivation and inspiration from generous sponsors like you.
