John Cris is living with his parents. His father, Inicris Tamayo., 26 years old, works as a vendor and earns \$119 monthly. His mother, Jessa Tamayo, 27 years old is a housewife. John Cris has been in the area for 5 years now. They are living in a house shared with their relatives. The house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof, cemented walls and cement floorings that is in good condition. It has 1 room with 2 windows. They use electricity as source of light. The family is able to eat three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from a shared water pipe and use charcoal for cooking. The family uses shared water sealed toilet and their household garbage is disposed through government disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Cabico family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having the child's complete education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, implements programs in health, education and psycho-social development and protection that benefit the children, their families and communities in the area. We hope that through the PSBP sponsorship program, the Cabico family could take part in our programs.
