She is an active 1st grader student at Iram Elementary School Subic, a government school located 150 meters from their residence. She walks in going to and from her school. Her performance in school is above average. She dreams of becoming a Doctor someday.

As a young child, Kiray loves to play. She likes to play hide-and-seek, playhouse, piko with her friends. Some of her favorite hobby is dancing, singing, reading and watching. More than just enjoying her childhood through playing and doing her recreational activities, she helps in the daily household chores as well like washing the dishes, sweeping the backyard and running errands during her spare time.

Kiray lives with her Family. Her Father, Nesty Rabaca, 39 years old, works as a Laborer and earns \$185 a month while her mother stays at home to take care the needs of the family. Their earnings are usually spent on basic necessities like food, education, utilities and medicines. I would like to introduce to you the other members of the family:

The family has been in the area for more than 7 years now. They shared their house with relatives and her grandmother owns it. Their house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof and cement for the floor and walls and in needs of repair. It has 1 multi-purpose room and 1 window which provide for the ventilation of the house. They are privileged to be provided with the basic utilities like electricity and water supply. The family eats three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from a pumpwell which they shared with their relatives and use a gas stove for cooking. The family uses a water-sealed type of toilet which they also shared and their household garbage is disposed of through government waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Rabaca family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having their children complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.


