She is an active 3rd grader student at Jica-Lao Elementary School, a government school located 500 meters from their residence. She walks in going to and from her school. Her performance in school is excellent. She dreams of becoming a Policewoman someday.

As a young child, Limar loves to play. She likes to tumbang preso, hide-and-peek, patintero with her friends. Some of her favorite hobby is watching and drawing. More than just enjoying his childhood through playing and doing his recreational activities, she helps in the daily household chores as well like washing dishes and cleaning the house during his spare time.

Limar lives with her Family. Her Father, Ramil Marquez, 49 years old, works as a Construction Worker and earns \$72 a month while her mother also works as a baby sitter to raise the family income. Their earnings are usually spent on basic necessities like food, education, utilities and medicines. I would like to introduce to you the other members of the family:

The family has been in the area for more than 8 years now. They lived in their own house under the property of the government. Their house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof and cement/plywood for the floor and walls which in a good condition. It has 1 multi-purpose room and 1 window which provide for the ventilation of the house. They are privileged to be provided with the basic utilities like electricity and water supply. The family eats three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from the well which they shared with the neighborhood and use a gas stove sometimes firewood for cooking. The family uses a water-sealed type of toilet and their household garbage is disposed of through government waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Marquez family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having their children complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.


