She is an active 1st grader student at Iram Elementary School, a government school located 400 meters from their residence. She walks in going to and from her school. Her performance in school is average and dreams of becoming a Teacher someday.

As a young child, Yanyan loves to play. She likes to play hide-and-seek and badminton with her friends. Some of her favorite hobbies are drawing, reading and watching television. More than just enjoying his childhood through playing and doing his recreational activities, she helps in the daily household chores as well like washing dishes, fetching water, cleaning the house, tending livestock's and running errands during his spare time.

Yanyan lives with her Family. Her Father, Mark Anthony Garcia, 36 years old, works as a Construction Worker and earns \$200 a month while her mother stays at home to take care the needs of the family. Their earnings are usually spent on basic necessities like food, education, utilities and medicines. I would like to introduce to you the other members of the family:

The family has been in the area for more than 10 years now. They live in their borrowed house. The house is built with G.I Sheets for the roof and cement walls and earthen flooring and in good condition. It has 1 room and 3 windows which provide for the ventilation of the house. They are privileged to be provided with the basic utilities like electricity and water supply. The family eats three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from a spring which they shared with the neighborhood and use a gas stove for cooking. The family uses a water-sealed type of toilet and their household garbage is disposed of through government waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Garcia family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having their children complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, has implemented programs in health, education and psycho-social development and protection that benefit the children, their families and communities. We hope that the Arenas family will be a part of our programs.

Yanyan and her family need assistance and your sponsorship will usher in new hope and confidence in the family as they work together for a brighter future. PSBP commits to facilitate a development process for the family so they may achieve lasting improvement in their lives.
