Her performance in school is above average. She dreams of becoming a Doctor someday.

As a young child, Dolly loves to play. She likes to volleyball, jumping rope, race and hide-and-seek with her friends. Some of her favorite hobby is dancing, singing and reading. More than just enjoying his childhood through playing and doing his recreational activities, she helps in the daily household chores as well like washing dishes, cleaning the house and running errands during his spare time.

Dolly lives with her Family. Her Father, Michael Pablo, 39 years old, works as a Farmer and earns \$54 a month while her mother stays at home to take care the needs of the family. Their earnings are usually spent on basic necessities like food, education, utilities and medicines. I would like to introduce to you the other members of the family:

The family has been in the area for more than 9 years now. They owned the house and lot where they live. Their house is built with Reed Grass for the roof and bamboo for the floor and plywood for the walls and in needs of repair. It has 1 multi-purpose room and 1 window which provide for the ventilation of the house. They are privileged to be provided with the basic utilities like electricity and water supply. The family eats three meals a day with rice, fish and vegetables being the usual combination. They get their water from a spring which they owned and use firewood for cooking. The family uses a water-sealed type of toilet and their household garbage is disposed of through Government Disposal System.

Like any other Filipino family, the Pablo family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having their children complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house and most importantly, increase their income.


