She is the youngest of two siblings and is fondly called Faye by her loved ones. Faye has a lovely morena complexion, stands 151 centimeters tall, and weighs 42 kilos. She was baptized as a Roman Catholic.

Faye is doing well! She has not experienced any significant health issues in the past year. She is a tenth-grader at Subic National High School SY 2022-2023, which is conveniently located just 1000 meters from her home. Faye rides a tricycle to and from school every day. Her favorite subject is Science, and aspires to be in the medical field someday.

During her leisure time, Faye finds joy in drawing Chibi Characters, singing Taylor Swift songs as she is one of the Swifties, and dancing to TikTok K-pop music. Faye also aids with daily household tasks such as washing dishes and cleaning the house.

Faye resides with her family, and they all cohabit under one roof. Sonny Saludez (57), Faye's father, is a tricycle driver who earns \$100 per month. Their income adequately covers their essential expenses, such as education, food, utilities, and medicine. Allow me to introduce you to the other member of their family:

This family has been living in the area for over 16 years, and they're currently residing in a house and lot that they're borrowing from their grandparents. The house is in good condition, with cement flooring and walls, and a G.I. sheet roof. It has one bedroom and three windows, ensuring proper ventilation. The family is lucky enough to have access to basic utilities like electricity and water supply. They use a gas stove and charcoal stove alternately for cooking, and they usually have three meals a day, consisting of rice, fish, and vegetables. They obtain their water from a shared pump well and have a water-sealed toilet. Household waste is disposed of through the government's waste disposal system.

Like any other Filipino family, the Saludez family wishes to improve their quality of life. The parents dream of having their children complete their education, enjoy good health, have a clean and orderly house, and most importantly, increase their income.

PSBP, together with the community, has implemented programs in health, education, and psycho-social development and protection that benefit the children, their families, and their communities. We hope that the Saludez family will be a part of our programs.

Faye and her family need assistance and your sponsorship will usher in new hope and confidence in the family as they work together for a brighter future. PSBP commits to facilitating a development process for the family so they may achieve lasting improvement in their lives.
