In his free time, Tapat enjoys various activities such as playing tumbang preso, hide and seek, playing with toys, patintero, soccer, Chinese garter, and racing. Tapat lives with his parents. His father, Jonathan Egagamao, is 38 years old and works as a laborer, earning \$80 per month. Their income sufficiently covers essential expenses including education, food, utilities, and medical needs.

The Egagamao family has been living in their well-maintained home for over 10 years. The house is constructed with cement and wood walls, cement floors, and a G.I. sheet roof. It includes a bedroom and 2 windows for ventilation. They have access to basic amenities such as electricity and water supply, and they use a firewood-fueled stove for cooking. They get their water from a piped water source and have a water-sealed toilet. Household waste is managed through the government's waste disposal system.


Like many Filipino families, the Egagamao family is focused on completing their child's education, maintaining good health, keeping their home clean and organized, and increasing their income.
