Currently in the third grade at Iram Elementary School for the 2024-2025 school year, Jyxell's school is conveniently located just 1200 meters from his home, allowing him to walk there every day. He excels in Mathematics and particularly enjoys writing, aspiring to become a teacher in the future.

During his leisure time, Jyxell delights in playing hide and seek, engaging with toys and racing games, drawing houses, singing the 'Thomas and Friends' theme song, dancing to the latest TikTok trends, and reading stories. At home, he actively takes part in chores like washing the dishes, fetching water, gathering firewood, babysitting, cleaning the house, and running errands.

Jyxell lives with his family, and his father, Jumar Osida, 41, works as a helper in a bakery, earning \$160 a month. Their income greatly contributes to covering essential expenses, including education, food, utilities, and medical needs.



The Osida family has been living in their current house for over 8 years. The walls are made of a combination of cement and GI sheets, with an earthen floor and a combination G.I. sheet and tarpaulin roof. The house is in need of repair. It consists of two bedrooms and has four windows for ventilation. They use solar panels for electricity and get their water from a spring shared with their neighbors. For cooking, they use a firewood-fuelled stove and have a water-sealed toilet. Household waste is managed through a compost pit system.

Similar to many Filipino families, the Osida family prioritizes their children's education, maintaining good health, keeping their home clean and organized, and increasing their income. There are community programs available to support health, education, and psychosocial development for families in need, and we encourage the Osida family to take advantage of these programs for new opportunities and a brighter future.

Your sponsorship of Jyxell and his family would significantly impact their journey toward sustainable progress. They are eager to communicate with you in English and share updates on important family events and achievements. Supporting families like the Osidas would greatly improve their quality of life. 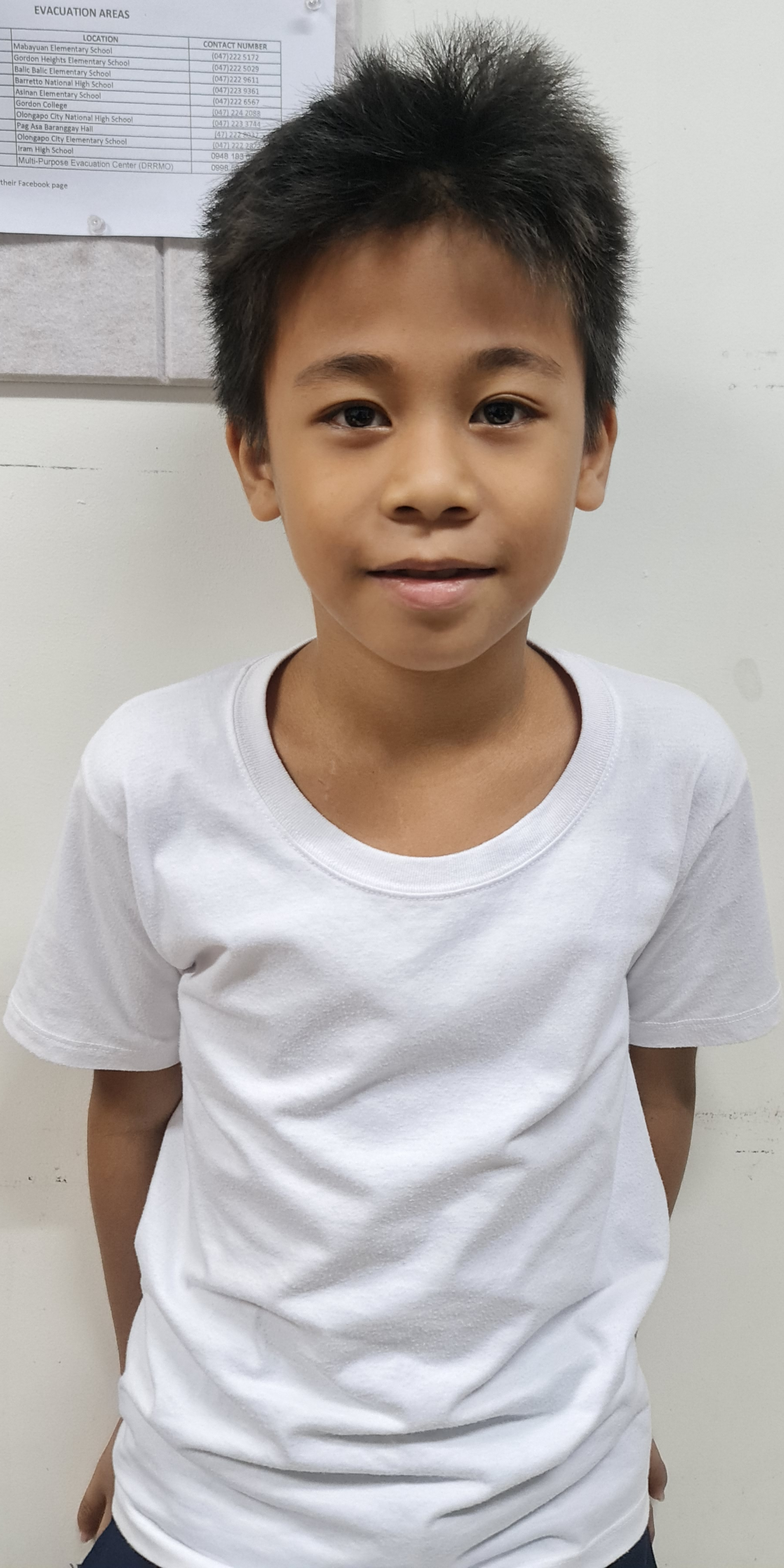

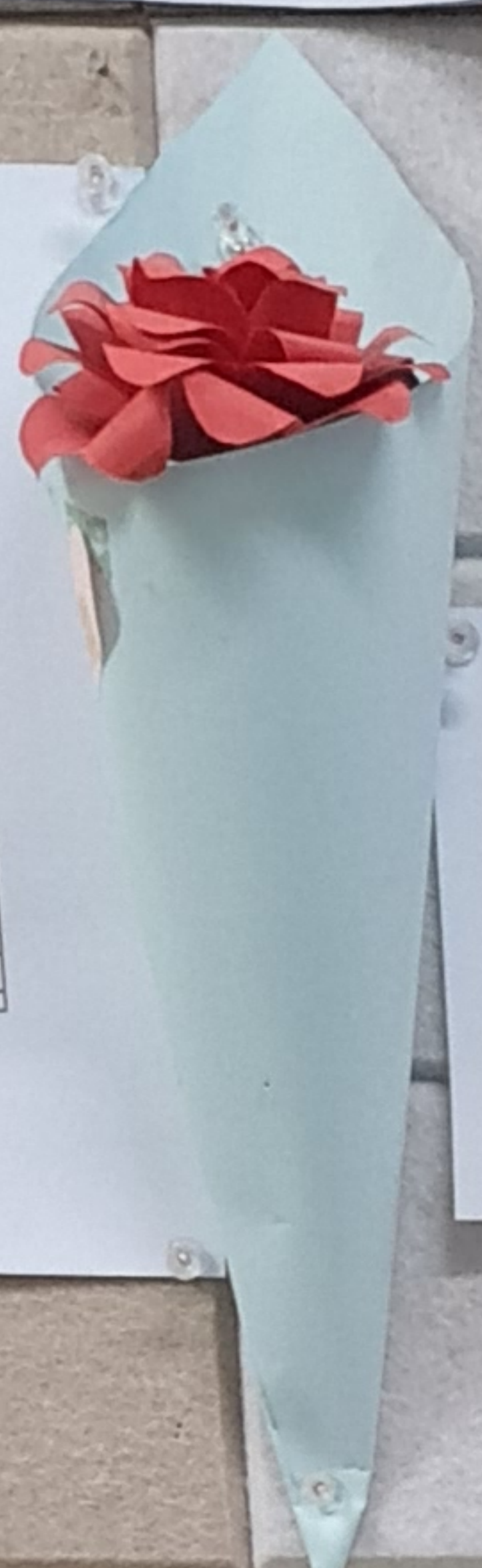
