She stands 135 centimeters tall, weighs 24 kilograms, and has a fair complexion with tiny moles under her eyes. The eldest of four siblings, Belen carries a quiet sense of responsibility and was baptized in the Roman Catholic faith.

Belen is a cheerful and active child. She has completed her COVID-19 vaccination and recently underwent deworming. Currently, she is enrolled in Grade 6 at Muzon Pabahay Elementary School, just a short ride away from home. Each day, she eagerly rides a tricycle to school, filled with determination to do her best. She dreams of becoming a flight attendant one day--a dream fueled by her love for learning. Her favorite subjects are Music, Arts, PE, and Health, and she shines in activities like writing contests.

Outside of school, Belen’s joyful spirit shines through her playfulness and creativity. She enjoys hide-and-seek, racing games, and playing Roblox. She has a deep love for music--often singing Taylor Swift’s *Enchanted* and dancing along to TikTok trends. At home, she gladly lends a hand by cooking rice and running errands for her family.

Belen lives with her caring parents and three younger siblings. Her father, Roben (30), works hard as a tricycle driver, earning about \$240 a month, while her mother, Roselyn (31), lovingly stays at home to care for their

children. Her siblings—Hanz Lester (10), a Grade 4 student; Prince Akihero (6), in Grade 1; and baby Precious, just 1 year old. Despite their determination and love for one another, the family’s modest income is not enough to meet their daily needs for food, healthcare, education, and basic living expenses.

The Agudo family has called their humble home of more than 11 years a place of comfort, even amidst life’s challenges. Their modest house, built with G.I. sheets for roofing and cement walls and flooring, is in good condition and is shared with their grandmother and relatives. Though the house has four rooms and two windows, Belen’s family occupies just one room of their own. Each household manages its own expenses, but they live together with a spirit of unity and care.

The family is grateful for the blessings they do have--electricity, a water-sealed toilet, and piped water to meet their daily needs. With love and resourcefulness, they prepare three simple meals each day--most often rice, fish, and vegetables--cooked over a gas stove. Household waste is carefully managed through the local government’s disposal system, reflecting their discipline and resilience.

Like many Filipino families, the Agudos hold firmly to their dreams of a brighter future. They long to see their children complete their education, grow up healthy, live in a safe and secure home, and one day achieve financial stability.


