On behalf of the Pearl S. Buck Foundation–Philippines, Inc. (PSBP), we are delighted to introduce Ana Migailano R. Roa, lovingly called Ana, and her family. Ana is a bright and cheerful 10-year-old girl, born on December 2, 2015, who is full of curiosity and hope for the future. As the eldest of two children, she stands 4 feet 8 inches tall, weighs 31 kilograms, and has a warm brown complexion. She was baptized as a Roman Catholic and is being raised with strong values of kindness, responsibility, and perseverance.

Ana has been in good health over the past year, with no major illnesses reported. She underwent a routine physical check-up in October 2025 due to a dry cough and has since recovered well. For School Year 2025–2026, Ana is in Grade 4 at Teodoro D. Tinio Elementary School, located about 1,400 meters from her home. She travels to school by tricycle each day and enjoys learning, especially in Filipino and drawing activities, where her creativity shines. Ana dreams of becoming a chef one day and is eager to work hard to make this dream a reality.

Outside the classroom, Ana enjoys playing traditional Filipino games such as tumbang preso, hide-and-seek,

patintero, and piko, as well as badminton and mobile games. She also loves drawing, dancing to music, watching anime, reading fairy tales, and gardening. At home, Ana willingly helps with household chores—washing dishes and clothes, cleaning, cooking, babysitting, and running errands—showing a strong sense of responsibility at a young age.

Ana lives with her mother, younger brother, and grandmother, who work together to provide for the family. Although her parents separated in 2022, her father continues to offer financial support of about \$120 per month. Her mother, Abigail Reyes (37), works as a house caretaker and earns approximately \$200 per month, while her grandmother, Nancy Whitt (62), receives a monthly pension of \$180. Ana’s younger brother, Liam David Roa (8), is currently in Grade 3. Through their combined efforts, the family is able to meet their basic needs, though resources remain limited.


The Roa family has been renting their home for more than 10 years, and despite the challenges they face, they have created a home filled with love, strength, and resilience. Their house, built with cement walls and flooring and topped with a G.I. sheet roof, provides the safety and stability they need. With two bedrooms and six windows that allow fresh air and natural light to flow in, their living space offers comfort and a sense of peace. The family is truly thankful for the basic utilities that support their daily life—electricity, clean piped water, and a gas stove for preparing meals. A water-sealed toilet and proper waste disposal also help ensure their everyday needs are met with dignity.

The Roas are a family who values hard work, perseverance, and unity. They place great importance on education, good health, and keeping a clean and orderly home, believing these are essential foundations for a better future. Although financial challenges remain part of their daily life, they continue to move forward with determination. They actively participate in community programs that support health, education, and psychosocial development, doing all they can to improve their situation and provide brighter opportunities for their children.
